What will I be asked to do?

If you are eligible for the study, you will:

- ❖ Participate in 2 - 4 interviews with a caring, qualified interviewer in which you can share aspects of your grief experience (with interview sessions held now and again in 6 months time)
- ❖ Complete a set of questionnaires about your grief experience at both sessions

Where are the sessions conducted?

We have two locations, and you may choose the one that is best for you.

Victims to Victory office, located at the Memphis Leadership Foundation building in Midtown (1548 Poplar)

University of Memphis campus, in East Memphis (400 Innovation Drive)

In some cases, we may be able to arrange an alternative location.

What else do I need to know?

All information is kept strictly confidential between you, our research staff, and V2V staff.

This study does not provide treatment, but you will still be able to take part in all the support activities of Victims to Victory.

What are the benefits of participating?

You will contribute to a better understanding of how tragic loss can affect people.

Your sharing your experience may help others who face similar losses.

You may find it helpful to talk to someone.

You will be paid \$25 for your time spent on each interview (up to a maximum of \$100)
